Course Description:

World History is a Pre-AP level course where students will learn and have an in depth understanding of historical events around the globe and use critical thinking skills dealing with historical events. Students will rigorously explore and research major themes of world history through collaborative learning. Students will also prepare for AP courses the following year by analyzing primary documents and writing essays based on prior AP exams.

Content will include:

First Quarter-Foundations of Civilization, Classical Empires Second Quarter-Medieval Rebuilding, Interactions and Diffusion, Expanding World Third Quarter-Ideas, Political Revolutions Fourth Quarter-Industrialization and Imperialism, Global Conflicts, Interdependence

Expectations:

Students will be expected to follow classroom procedures and classroom norms. Students will learn how to read and write at a college level by critically analyzing and critiquing articles of scholastic value. Classroom discussions based on lessons are allowed and strongly encouraged. Classroom participation is essential and non-participation will result in a call home and or a failing grade. Technology will be utilized in the classroom, however the use of personal devices are a privilege and not a right. It will be at my discretion on when personal devices can be used during class.

MAKE-UP WORK:

If you know you will be missing class, please arrange to pick up your work and/or use Edmodo. Remember that even if you are out, you are responsible for your part of any collaborative work and must be in contact with your group.
